LEARNING OUTCOME

Children will:

- Understand how industrial waste and human negligence pollute water sources.
- Learn about the ripple effect of pollution on fish, plants, and communities.
- Be introduced to the concept of environmental activism and standing up for nature.
- Recognize that anyone, regardless of age, can spark change.
- Reflect on their own water usage and how to protect this vital resource.

LESSON PLAN

The River Warrior offers a real-world lens into environmental activism. Through discussion, activities, and reflection, children learn that clean water is a shared responsibility. The story opens up conversations about waste management, advocacy, and long-term ecological care.

Discussion Questions

Before Reading:

- What are some ways we use water every day?
- Have you ever seen a polluted river or lake? What did it look or smell like?
- Where do you think the trash in water comes from?
- Why is clean water important to all living things?

During Reading:

- What made Prigi upset about the river?
- What kind of waste was being dumped in the Brantas River?
- How did Prigi respond to the pollution?
- What challenges did he face?

After Reading:

- Why do you think some people ignored the pollution problem?
- What do you admire most about Prigi's actions?
- How can communities come together to clean water bodies?
- What would you do if your local river was polluted?

LESSON PLAN

Activities:

- Water Watchers Journal: Students observe and document how water is used (and wasted) in their homes for a week.
- Pollution Simulation: Use a bowl of water with bits of trash to represent a polluted river. Students brainstorm cleanup solutions.
- Poster Campaign: Create posters urging people not to dump garbage into rivers.
- Interview Project: Interview local environmentalists or community workers.
- Class Resolution: Write and sign a 'River Warrior Pledge' to protect water.
