

LEARNING OUTCOME

Students will understand how individual initiative can transform lives and communities. They will reflect on the role of youth in creating change and learn that compassion and action are universal values

LESSON PLAN

A story-based discussion about literacy, followed by reflection activities that invite students to consider their own role in supporting others, and understanding the global importance of access to education.

Discussion Questions

Before Reading:

- What does literacy mean to you?
- Why do you think reading and writing are important?

During Reading:

- How did Alvian's life change after his family tragedy?
- What obstacles did he and his friends face in their mission?

After Reading:

- How do you think children feel when they have to leave school or cannot study?
- How can young people help others learn?
- Do you know anyone who is working to make the world a better place, whether in your neighbourhood, country or anywhere in the world? What must be their motivation to give of themselves to work for the greater good?

Activities:

- Write Your Why: Students write a paragraph on why they believe literacy is important for everyone.
- Support a Cause: Research and present one organization that supports children's literacy around the world. Discuss how students might support it.
- Locate Borneo: Use a world map to find Indonesia and Borneo. Talk about what it might be like to travel across forests and rivers to teach.
- Empathy Circle: Create a circle time where students reflect on how they would feel if they couldn't go to school or read.
