LEARNING OUTCOME

Children will:

- Recognize the value of trees in everyday life.
- Understand how small actions—like saving one tree—can have an environmental impact.
- Appreciate that standing up for what is right can start at any age.
- Practice interpreting visual storytelling and expressing ideas through images.

LESSON PLAN

Use this story to open a conversation about trees and their importance. Let children share experiences of trees near their homes or schools. Reinforce ideas through discussion and drawing activities.

Discussion Questions

Before Reading:

- Do you have a favorite tree? Why do you like it?
- What animals or insects have you seen in or around trees?

During Reading:

- What do you think the girl is feeling?
- What is the boy doing?
- Why do you think she wants to save the tree?

After Reading:

- Why was the tree important to the little girl?
- What would you do if someone wanted to cut down a tree near your house?
- How did the girl’s actions help change her brother’s mind?

Activities:

- **Draw Your Favorite Tree:** Children draw a tree and the creatures or they imagine living in or around it.
- **Tree Hug Pledge:** Create a classroom pledge to care for trees and nature.
- **Silent Storytelling:** Ask children to 'tell' the story in their own words or sounds using the pictures.
- Get an autograph of a few trees in their neighborhood by making a rubbing of the bark and try and identify them.
