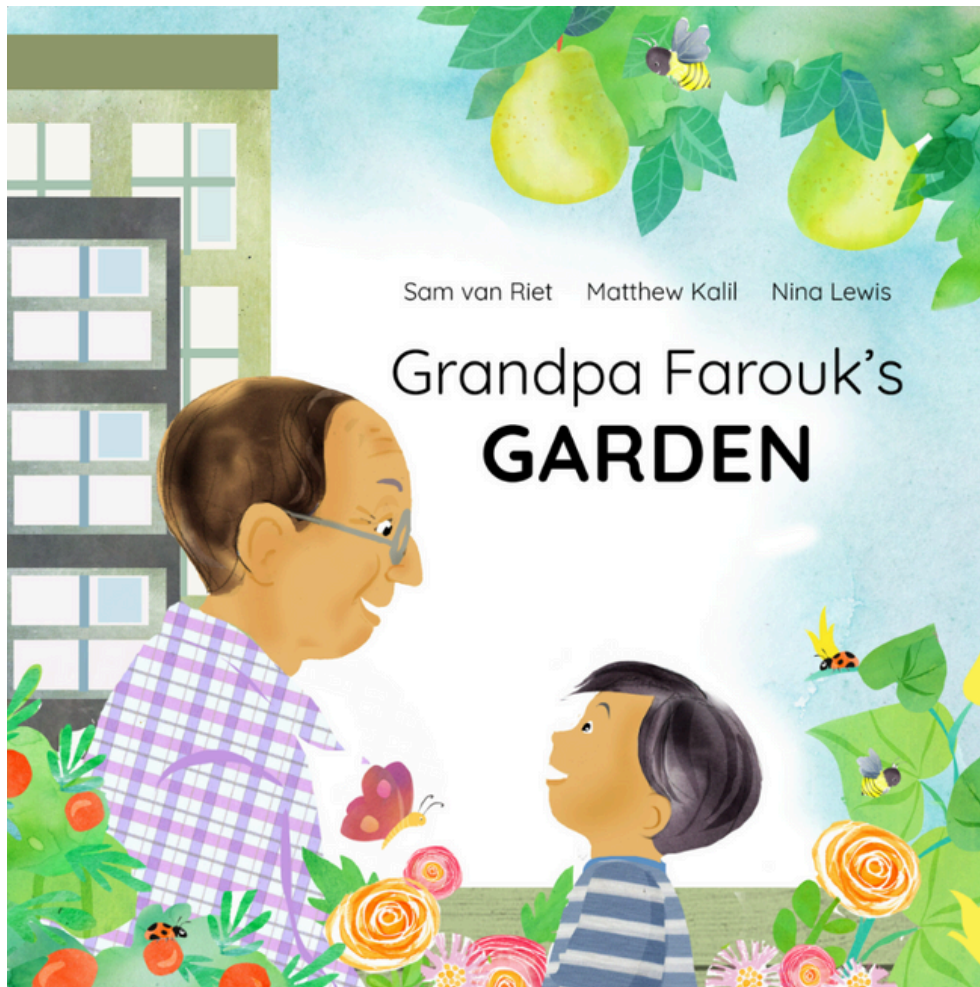

LEARNING OUTCOME

Children will:

- Learn how insects keep plants healthy.
- Appreciate interdependence between humans, plants, and animals.
- Respect nature through observation and care.
- Value wisdom passed down between generations.
- Internalize Zamasama’s value of One Common Humanity.

LESSON PLAN

Discussion Questions

Before Reading:

- Discuss what grows in gardens. Ask if children have seen insects on flowers.

During Reading:

- Pause to ask why insects are important.

After Reading:

- Explore what might happen if there were no insects.

Activities:

- Draw a garden with insects.
- Observation walk: note plants, flowers, and insects nearby.
- Pollination role-play: children act as bees moving “pollen” between flowers.
