

Story Discussion Guide

- Recognize that friendship and love can exist even in times of conflict and uncertainty.
- Understand that large historical events can deeply affect children's lives.
- Develop empathy for children who are separated from friends and familiar places.
- Reflect on how acts of giving can express deep care and friendship.
- Appreciate that race, religion, and nationality do not define true friendship.
- Internalize the core value of one common humanity.

Activities (Ages 5-8):

1.The Meaning of a Gift

Students discuss the significance of the cap and create drawings of gifts they would give a friend.

2. What Makes a True Friend?

Create a friendship chart highlighting loyalty, kindness, sharing, and helping.

Activities (Ages 8-10):

1. Talking About Sudden Separation

Discuss how children might feel when forced to leave friends suddenly.

2. Goodbye Note or Drawing

Students write or draw a final message from Mukand to Riaz.

3. Friendship Memory Quilt

Class creates a visual memory quilt made of friendship moments.

Learning Outcomes (Ages 10-12)

Students understand how political upheavals affect ordinary families, especially children.

They develop empathy for displaced families and reflect on peaceful solutions for harmony.
