


Rent Party Jazz

Story Discussion Guide

- Understand the value of community and support during tough times.
- Appreciate how music and cultural traditions can uplift people.
- Recognize the challenges faced by single-parent families.
- Reflect on empathy and generosity as tools for change.
- Explore the universal language of music and its cultural expressions around the world.
- Understand that helping others is a shared human value found in every country.

Lesson plan

This story helps students explore poverty, resilience, and the power of music. It also creates space to discuss homelessness and community action with compassion and creativity. It introduces the global nature of music—how different cultures use sound and rhythm to express joy, struggle, and unity—and shows that acts of kindness transcend borders.

Learning Outcome

Before Reading:

- What do you think life was like during the Great Depression?
- What is jazz? How do you feel when you listen to music?
- Do you know any styles of music from other countries?

During Reading :

- How did Sonny and his mom cope with their situation?
- Why was Smilin' Jack's music important?
- How did the neighbors respond?

After Reading:

- Have you ever seen your community come together to help someone?
- What part of the story stood out to you the most?
- Why is kindness powerful—even when we don’t have much?
- Can you think of ways people help one another in other parts of the world?

Activities:

- Jazz Collage: Create a collage with drawings or magazine clippings featuring words like music, hope, and community. Play jazz while students work.
- Rent Party Roleplay: Host a mini classroom “Rent Party” with student-made posters, music, and creative fundraising ideas for a local cause.
- What Is a Home? Discuss what “home” means. Talk about homelessness and how it can happen for many reasons—not always in someone’s control.
- Global Music Day: Explore musical styles from around the world (samba, reggae, k-pop, taarab, etc.) and how they reflect each culture’s spirit and values.
