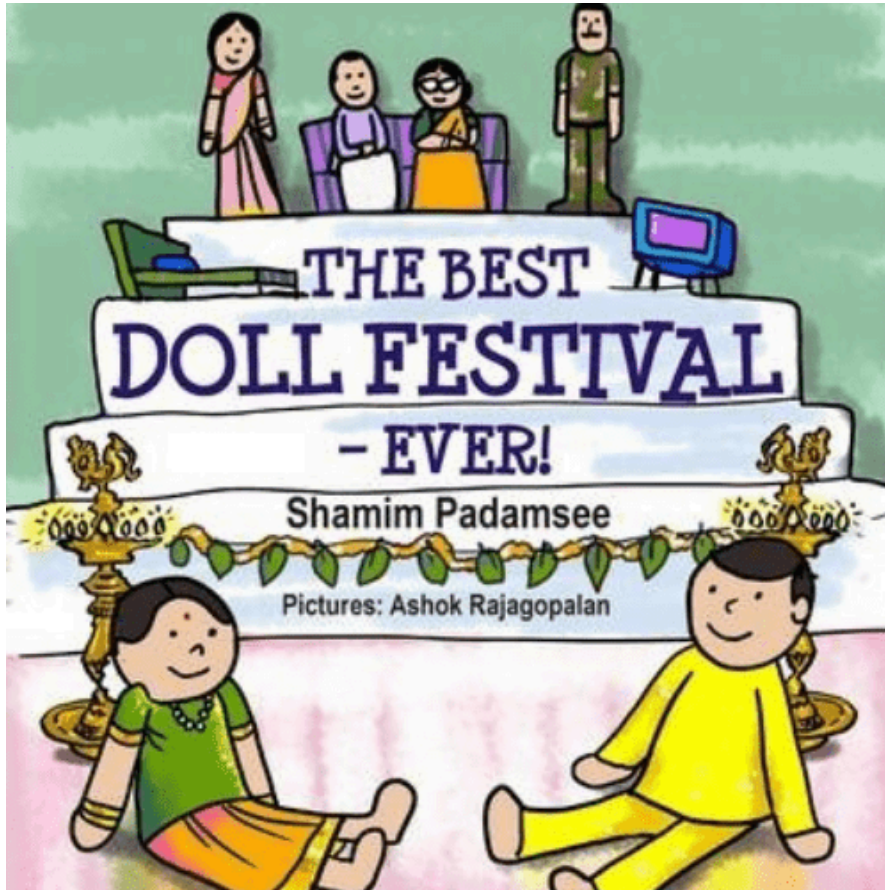


The Best Doll Festival, Ever!

Story Discussion Guide

- Understand the significance of cultural traditions and festivals.
- Recognize the value of initiative and responsibility in preserving heritage.
- Reflect on the role of family and community in upholding cultural practices.
- Acknowledge that children around the world eagerly look forward to festivals full of food, joy, and togetherness

Lesson plan

Through story-based discussion and cultural activities, students explore how family traditions create joy and belonging, no matter the circumstances.

Learning Outcome

Before Reading:

- What festivals do you celebrate with your family?
- Why are these festivals important to you?

During Reading :

- Why are Ravi and Rani disappointed at first?
- What do they decide to do for their mother?

After Reading:

- How do they feel once the dolls are arranged?
- What does their effort tell us about family and care?

Activities:

- Golu Display Challenge
- Festival Joy Drawing
- Global Festival Exchange
- Story Stones: Golu Edition – Students paint flat stones with characters or objects found in a Golu display, then tell short stories about them.
- Build-A-Tier Challenge – Using cups or cardboard, students build a mini 3-tier Golu shelf and decorate it with festival-themed objects.
- Festival Recipe Share – Students draw or describe a favorite festival dish from their family, contributing to a ‘Festival Food Around the World’ class display.
- Design-a-Doll Outfit – Create traditional or imaginative outfits for paper dolls representing different Indian or global cultures.

Expected Outcomes

- Enhanced understanding of cultural traditions
- Empathy and appreciation for global cultural practices
- Development of personal initiative and cultural reflection
