


Muthu and Kappu



it came from."


Gangu and Raja were very, very sad.

"Muthu!"


"Pappa, come fast!"


Gangu, Raja and Muthu's wife Poovi stared

Muthu paused. Finally, he said, "OK. But once he gets better, you'll have to find a home for him. A *different* home."




Over the next week, Muthu watched the kitten from a distance.


He was wild.

But Muthu had never seen Gangu and Raja this happy.


And sometimes, even he could admit that the kitten was rather funny.


