


Bounthy's Singing Birds

Story Discussion Guide

Children will:

- Understand that birds are living beings who deserve freedom
- Reflect on how animals might feel in captivity
- Learn how to advocate for kindness to animals
- Recognize the joy of nature sounds and biodiversity
- Build empathy through imaginative and sensory exploration

Lesson Plan

Learning Outcome

A story to spark empathy for animals, explore the ethical issues of caging birds, and celebrate nature's music.

Before Reading – Warm-up Questions:

1. Have you seen birds flying freely or in cages?
2. What kinds of sounds do birds make?

During Reading- Engagae Students:

- How does Bounthy feel when the birds stop singing?
- What do you think the birds are feeling?

After Reading – Discussion Questions:

1. Is it right to keep birds in cages? Why or why not?
2. If you were a bird in a cage, how would you feel?
3. How can we help protect animals like birds?

Activities:

- Soundscape Play: Use background music with nature sounds. Ask children to add bird calls—chirps, whistles, hoots, etc.
- Poster-Making: Create “Birds Belong in Nature” posters.
- Vocabulary Builder: Identify and name different bird sounds and birds in your area.

Home Reflection:

- Talk to your family about why it's better to admire wild animals in nature instead of keeping them as pets.
- Consider adopting only rescued birds if your family ever wants one, not taking from the wild.

Explore Other Relevant Zamasama Stories

- The Tale of the Water Hyacinth – using nature creatively without harming it
- Jadav and the Tree-Place – planting trees to protect ecosystems
- The River Warrior – taking action to protect nature
- Bye-Bye Plastic Bags – young people fighting environmental harm

Expected Outcomes

Children will show increased empathy for living creatures and awareness of animal welfare. They will begin to understand that animals, like humans, have needs and feelings.
